British Youth Championships 2016



Congratulations go to Mhairi McLaughlin (5D1) who in the past few months has achieved great success in Fencing whereby she has achieved the following:-

- 3rd in the Edinburgh Open in March
- 5th in the Birmingham International Open at the end of March. This was particularly impressive as she was 5th in a field of 61 the Scottish Open competitions usually have an entry list of 15-25.
- 3rd in the Glasgow Open in April

As a result, Mhairi went up from a senior UK women's foil ranking of 73 in September 2015 and 41 in March 2016 to 16th in April 2016, although she is currently ranked 19th.

In addition to her senior results Mhairi won the Under 16 Girls Foil competition at the British Youth Championships, which was an amazing result. In addition to these fantastic achievements Mhairi is now the Girls Under 17 Foil Scottish Youth Champion following the Scottish Youth Championships at the weekend.

These are tremendous successes that Mhairi has achieved it highlights the success that you can achieve with dedication and hard work. Well done Mhairi!

S5 Convenor's Challenge 2016

On Friday 10 June a team of 4 S5 pupils from St Augustine's competed in the Edinburgh Convenor's Challenge. The team members, Justin Lipinski, Erin Sutherland, Adam Mclean and Mhairi McLaughlin competed against 12 other schools and worked extremely hard throughout the day as they pedalled, paddled and plotted their way across the city.

The Convener's Challenge was designed to encourage teams of school pupils to develop strategies that will enable them to complete a series of activity challenges. Developed and delivered by the Sports and Outdoor Learning unit.

The aim of the challenge was to complete a range of challenges around the city:

- Activity Challenge, where competitors must complete a physical, outdoor challenge
- City Challenge which was a series of information-gathering challenges designed to test competitors' navigation and observation skills
- Super Summit Challenge, where the aim is to get to the top of as many of Edinburgh's seven hills as is possible.



The team from St Augustine's completed 3 activity challenges- Orienteering at Corstorphine Hill, a water based challenge on the Union Canal and Abseiling at Blackford Quarry.

They completed 26 City Challenges and also managed to reach the Summit of 5 of Edinburgh's "Seven Hills" covering a total distance of 39km - 35km of which was on Foot!

The team from St Augustine's came in 2nd place with a total of 8365 points narrowly missing out on 1st place by 65 points. The team thoroughly enjoyed the challenge and were a credit to the school. Well Done!
