



Positive Considerations

- subjects that your child will enjoy and succeed in
- subjects that are right for your child ones that relate to their interests, abilities and strengths
- think ahead about what they might like to do when they leave school
- check which subjects and qualifications they might need, or find helpful, to get into any careers or courses they are interested in
- think about the skills they will need to be successful in the future.



Negative Considerations

- choose a subject just because they like or dislike the teacher
- pick a subject just so they can be in the same class as their friends
- worry if they have no clear career ideas yet keep their options open
- limit their future career options by thinking that some subjects and careers are only for girls or boys.



How you can help

- Talk with your child about their progress and future career path
- Encourage them to keep their options as open as possible.
 They may already have some ideas about what they want to
 do in the future, but these could change. For many young
 people it's still too early to have specific career ideas or
 interests.
- Talk to their teachers and/or career adviser if you need more information or you have any worries about their subject choice.
- Encourage them to ask for help and advice in school if they feel they need it
