Equalities Agenda

You will be aware that an investigation was undertaken by The City of Edinburgh Council into racist incidents across the authority. The draft report will be discussed at the Education, Children and Families Committee and can be found here.

There has been some local press coverage on this, and I wanted to assure the community that we are committed to undertake the action steps given in this report.

We will seek to engage members from across the community: learners, parents/carers, partners, and staff as we collaborate on how to ensure every individual feels safe, supported and proud to be part of St. Augustine's.

In school, we have formed an Equalities Committee (thank you to those learners who have already volunteered) and welcome any other student who is interested. This group will work to implement and embed council policies relating to equalities as well as shape our improvement journey in this area.

At the next Parent Council meeting, I will give an update on all the work St. Augustine's is currently undertaking in relation to equalities and speak to the report in more detail. Please note the following has already been undertaken this session and will continue to develop at pace:

- Student Representative Council worked with staff on the revised Equalities and Anti-Bullying Policy, published in Dec 2020 and can be found here on our website.
- Pupil Equalities Committee/ Equalities Ambassadors group set up.
- Staff training:
 - All staff have completed the authority Equalities Training Modules
 - All staff have attended a session on 'Racial Literacy' led by Edinburgh Caribbean Association in January 21

 - "De-colonising the curriculum"

- "So, you want to make a difference"
- We gained the Rights Respecting School Bronze Award and are now working towards the Silver Award.
