You will be aware that, as part of the SQA's Alternative Certification Model, our teachers are busy determining provisional grades for your child, which will be submitted to the SQA on Friday 25 June.

I am writing to inform you that your child's provisional grades will be emailed after school on Wednesday 23 June and that you will also receive a copy of the letter by email.

The Senior Leadership Team will host a "Provisional Grades Information Event" online on **Thursday 24th June 2021 at 1930**. We appreciate that there may be questions and queries after the provisional grades are shared. As a school we close for the Summer holidays on Friday 25th June and there will not be an

opportunity to contact any teaching staff to discuss the provisional grades until 16th August 2021.

There will be a short presentation (10 mins) about the steps the school has undertaken to arrive at the provisional grades. Then there will be the opportunity to ask questions. Senior Induction

The Pupil Support Team provided training for the new S5 and S6 this week. We look forward to working with these young people in leading our community.

All leavers are expected to be in school every day until their final assessment is completed. At this point, they should have their leaver's form completed by staff (to ensure no more work is needed) and hand this in to their Pupil Support Leader.

All S4 and S5 learners who are staying on will continue to attend lessons where they will complete any outstanding qualifications. After this, there are several different short courses available. These courses are accredited and will enhance the attainment of each learner. From Monday 14th June, we have organised a well-being award for seniors to undertake, again this will increase their portfolio of qualifications and support their own wellbeing.

As the assessment calendar has completed and learners are completing any final actions for their qualifications, we will not produce any more engagement reports. Please note that we will contact you directly if work is still outstanding.

We will produce a final presentation level report next week so you are clear as to what level your child is taking for each subject.

International Research – Parents of S1, S2 and S3 we need your help!!!

We have been selected to participate in an international academic research programme. St. Augustine's is one of three schools involved from Scotland with other schools from Sweden and Finland.

Please see the message sent by Mr Dalgleish earlier this week:

"Providing high quality teaching and support for all of our pupils is a key priority at St Augustine's. To this end, we have partnered with the University of Edinburgh to take part in an international research project entitled "Teaching that Matters for Migrant Students". Through participation in this project we aim to ensure that we learn how to meet the needs of migrant students more effectively, which will also help us better meet the needs of all students.

Part of this project involves online surveys of students from all backgrounds and it would be beneficial if as many students in S1-3 as possible completed the survey. These surveys are short and we would complete these within school. A few pupils may then be asked to take part in an interview at a later date.

For Attention of EU citizens:

EU Settlement Scheme

To stay in the UK, EU citizens, including children, who were living in the UK by 31 December 2020 and who do not have indefinite leave to remain must apply to the UK Government's EU Settlement Scheme. The deadline for applications is fast approaching, with the scheme closing <u>on 30 June 2021</u>. Non-EU family members can also apply. If they have an EU permanent residence card or an EU residence certificate, they will still need to apply. If they do not apply, they may lose their right to live, work and study in the UK.

A package of support is available for anyone who needs additional help. The Stay in Scotland toolkit includes information on the EU Settlement Scheme, details of the application process, and links to other resources. Full details can be found at <u>www.mygov.scot/stayinscotland</u>. Citizens Advice Scotland operate a free national helpline as part of their EU Citizen Support Service. People can receive information, advice and support for applying to the EU Settlement Scheme by calling the freephone helpline on <u>0800 916 9847</u>. The service has qualified advisers who will help them apply to the EU Settlement Scheme. Citizens Advice Scotland have two solicitors who can help people with more complex immigration histories.

The legal charity, JustRight Scotland, have published a series of factsheets on EU citizens' rights. These factsheets detail their rights to vote and work, and to access healthcare, education, housing and benefits in Scotland. These factsheets can be found at <u>www.justcitizens.scot/EU/</u>

Session date change Christmas holidays 2021 (Notice from the Authority)

At its March meeting, the Education, Children and Families Committee agreed to change the scheduled Christmas holiday dates from Friday 24 December 2021 - Monday 10 January 2022 to Monday 20 December 2021 - Tuesday 4 January 2022.

The change was based on a similar amendment to the previous year's holiday dates. The reasons for the change are set out in this committee report:

The report did not include consideration of the in-service day after the holidays. This will be Wednesday 5 January 2022. To ensure that pupils are in school for the required 190 days, the summer term will be amended to finish on **Friday 1 July 2022** instead of **Thursday 30 June**.

The agreed changes are now on the Council website, along with dates for dates for 2022/23, 2023/24 and 2024/25.



School tie must be worn		
A white school shirt must be worn		
A black v neck jumper or black v neck cardigan	Not acceptable: Hoodies/round neck jumpers/cardigans Fashion logos eg Hollister, Jack Wills etc	\$
Smart black trousers	Not acceptable: Jeans, joggers, leggings, jeggings, combats	
Black skirt of an appropriate length	Not acceptable: Short/tube skirts unsuitable for active learning in classrooms	\$
Black leggings can <u>only</u> be worn with a skirt	Not acceptable: Leggings on their own	\$
Outdoor coats/jackets must be removed in the school building	/	
Blue school blazer with school badge (for years S5 & S6)	/
