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Moment of reflection

1. Senior Examinations in May 2022

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The Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) have produced a <u>blog post for</u> <u>parents and carers</u> to provide an update for the examinations in May. The preferred plan is still for the examinations to take place, but this post explains other possibilities too.

We would like to highlight one paragraph from the blog which offers current support to learners in their study – please access this:

There is revision support currently available for learners. Education Scotland, in partnership with e-Sgoil, is running a series of Study Support Webinars for learners working towards National Qualifications in 2022. Details can be found on the e-Sgoil website and you should speak to your child's teacher or lecturer if you require further information.

2. <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Booster</u> message from Scottish Government

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Make sure you book your COVID-19 booster to maximise protection People aged 18 and over can book boosters online.

All adults aged 18 and over can book their appointment for a COVID-19 vaccine booster through the online portal on NHS inform:

<u>www.nhsinform.scot/covid19vaccinebooster</u> If you are unable to access the online portal you can book an appointment through the National Helpline on 0800 030 8013.

Even if you've been double-vaccinated, your immunity against COVID-19 wanes over time. That's why boosters are necessary. The booster vaccine gives you the protection you need against serious COVID-19 illness. Local Health Boards are offering additional drop-in facilities - you can find information on local health board websites and social media.

Appointments must be booked at least 12 weeks after a second dose however adults with a confirmed case of the virus since receiving a vaccine should wait four weeks from testing positive to receive their booster. Even if you have had COVID-19 it is still important you come forward and complete your vaccination course to maximise your protection. Anyone in earlier groups who missed their vaccination can book an appointment by calling the National Helpline on **0800 030 8013** which is open from 8am to 8pm, 7 days a week.

8. <u>Empowerment Project Update (new iPads)</u>

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This week has seen the roll out of iPads to all our learning community. Those who were absent will have a chance to catch up with this in the coming weeks.



Now that every pupil is set up with an ipad, there are a few procedures that everybody should be aware of:

- Ipads should be brought into school every day and fully charged.
- Unless a teacher instructs you to use your ipad, it should be flat on your desk with the cover over the screen or in your bag. Nobody should be on an ipad in class without being instructed to do so.
- When instructed to use your ipad you should only use your ipad for the task given.
 There is software to support teaching staff in monitoring this.
- Ipads should not be used when walking around the corridors. This is to avoid accidents.
- If you have a problem with your ipad please email Mr Boothroyd and let him know exactly what the problem is. He will contact you or find you during school when he can. Please do not turn up at his desk looking for him unless instructed to do so and be patient. It may take a few days.

Remember that your ipad belongs to the school. Any ipads being missued could be removed by a member of staff and may not be returned, even if needed in class. Look after your ipad as any damage to the ipad or your charger may have to be paid for.

We look forward to using this versatile and powerful piece of equipment to support the learning at St. Augustine's RC High School. The Maths faculty has already procured a subscription to Complete Maths by La Salle Education.

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We have started using a system called "Class Charts" that allows us to track actions closely. To enable you to log onto your child's account you should visit https://www.classcharts.com/parent/login

There is also a free app available on the Apple App store or the Google Play store, called ClassCharts Parents.

When you log in you will see information regarding your child's interactions since we returned to school from the Christmas break. If the account says that there is no data, it will simply be because no interaction has been recorded in that time.

Chinese New Year, also known as Lunar New Year or Spring Festival, is just around the corner. Chinese New Year or Lunar New Year 2022 will fall on **Tuesday, February 1st, 2022**, starting **a year of the Tiger**.

The date of Chinese New Year changes every year, but it always falls between January 21st and February 20th. The date is decided by the Chinese Lunar Calendar, which is based on cycles of the moon and sun and is generally 21–51 days behind the internationally used calendar.



Celebrations of <u>Chinese New Year</u> traditionally last for 16 days, starting from Chinese New Year's Eve to the Lantern Festival. In 2022, that is from January 31st to February 15th.



Mondays – 9.30am-12.30pm Tuesdays – 9.30am-12.30pm From 31 January, 5–21 year olds living in Scotland will be eligible for free bus travel across Scotland with a valid **National Entitlement Card (NEC)**. You can apply from **10 January 2022**.

However, in light of high levels of COVID-19 transmission, the Scottish Government is asking that you only apply for the scheme at this point if it is essential* that you, or your child, travel while restrictions are in place. All other eligible applicants will be proactively encouraged to apply at a later date.

*There is no prescribed list of what constitutes essential travel – it will differ for different children, young people and families. But it might include travel for education, training, work, care or health reasons.

Even if your child already has a National Entitlement Card or Young Scot National Entitlement Card, they must apply for a new or replacement card to travel by bus for free.
