




Head Teacher's Update



"Our Senior Leadership Team, the Preventing Gender Based Violence Group and PC Millar, our school Police Officer, spoke to all pupils during assemblies about gender based violence happening in school.

They explained what gender based violence is, how to report it, how to gain support if experiencing this behaviour and the steps taken by police and school to stop this behaviour happening. This was all made clear to pupils and staff present.

In St. Augustine's we will continue to support pupils experiencing gender based violence and make sure this damaging behaviour is stopped.

6. National Sleep Helpline (message from Liz Wilson from The Sleep Charity)

At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80%) with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support for sleep issues. Sleep problems can leave people feeling isolated and lonely.

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Our free helpline is run by trained sleep advisors, many of whom are specialists in working with SEND. We can talk to young people directly, or parents (we can also talk to adults, including older people, about their sleep issues).

The helpline is open 5 times a week, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday evenings 7-9pm, and Wednesday mornings 9-11am. The number is 03303 530 541.

18. <u>Well Done Ben Malcolm</u> (message from Mr Milne)


